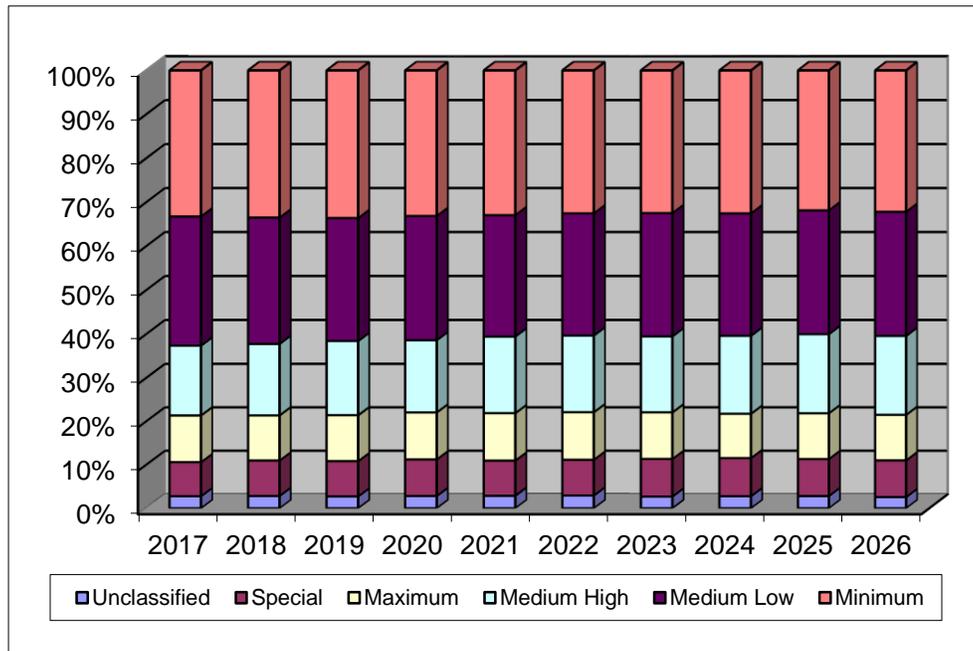

Summary of Custody Classification Projections

As projected in the ten-year prison population projection simulation model, the end of FY 2017 forecasts the total prison population to reach 9,722, including 8,878 males and 844 females. Of the male population, it is projected that 255 unclassified beds, 786 special management beds, 1,214 maximum beds, 1,494 medium high beds, 2,625 medium low beds and 2,504 minimum beds will be needed by the end of FY 2017. By the end of FY 2026, the male prison population is expected to reach 10,065. Of this population, it is projected that 308 unclassified beds, 952 special management beds, 1,355 maximum beds, 1,696 medium high beds, 2,846 medium low beds and 2,908 minimum beds will be needed (Table 1).

Female prison population is projected to reach 844 inmates in FY 2017 and 899 inmates in FY 2026. Of this population, it is projected that 41 unclassified beds, 16 special management beds, 81 maximum beds, 97 medium high beds, 177 medium low beds and 432 minimum beds will be needed by the end of FY 2017. By the end of FY 2026, it is projected that 44 unclassified beds, 18 special management beds, 82 maximum beds, 105 medium high beds, 167 medium low beds and 483 minimum beds will be needed (Table 2).

The overall custody classification projection indicates that 296 unclassified beds, 802 special management beds, 1,295 maximum beds, 1,591 medium high beds, 2,802 medium low beds and 2,936 minimum beds will be needed by the end of FY 2017. The total projected prison beds, by the end of FY 2026, will include 352 unclassified beds, 970 special management beds, 1,437 maximum beds, 1,801 medium high beds, 3,013 medium low beds and 3,391 minimum beds. Over the ten-year forecast period, minimum custody beds will increase by 455 beds, medium low custody beds will increase by 211 beds, medium high beds will increase by 210 beds, maximum beds will go up by 142 beds and special management beds indicate an increase of 168 beds. Unclassified beds will increase by 56 beds (Table 3).

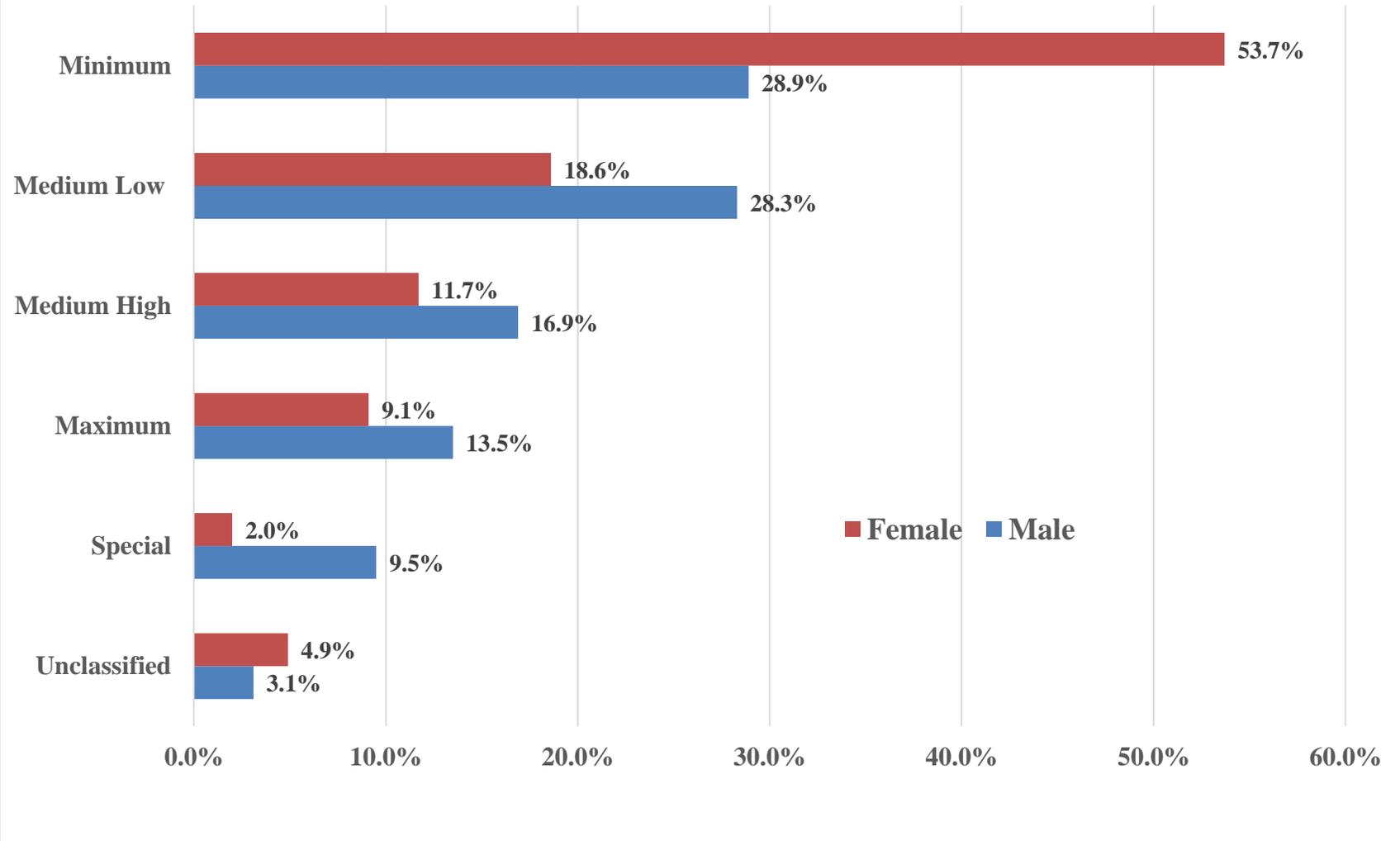


Figure 3: Percentage Distribution Comparison over the Ten-Year Forecast Period by Gender

The percentage distributions of the custody classifications in terms of types of beds needed demonstrate a significant difference between male and female. Males need 2.9% unclassified, 8.9% special management, 13.7% maximum, 16.8% medium high, 29.6% medium low and 28.2% minimum custody beds by the end of FY 2017. Females need 4.9% unclassified, 1.9% special management, 9.6% maximum, 11.5% medium high, 21.0% medium low and 51.2% minimum custody beds by the end of FY 2017 (Figure 1). Over the ten-year forecast period, for males, the percentage distributions of custody classification beds remains relatively constant, except the minimum low beds, which indicates a decrease of 1.3%. For females, the percentage distributions of medium low beds will decrease while the minimum beds will increase. All other beds will remain almost unchanged (Figure 3).

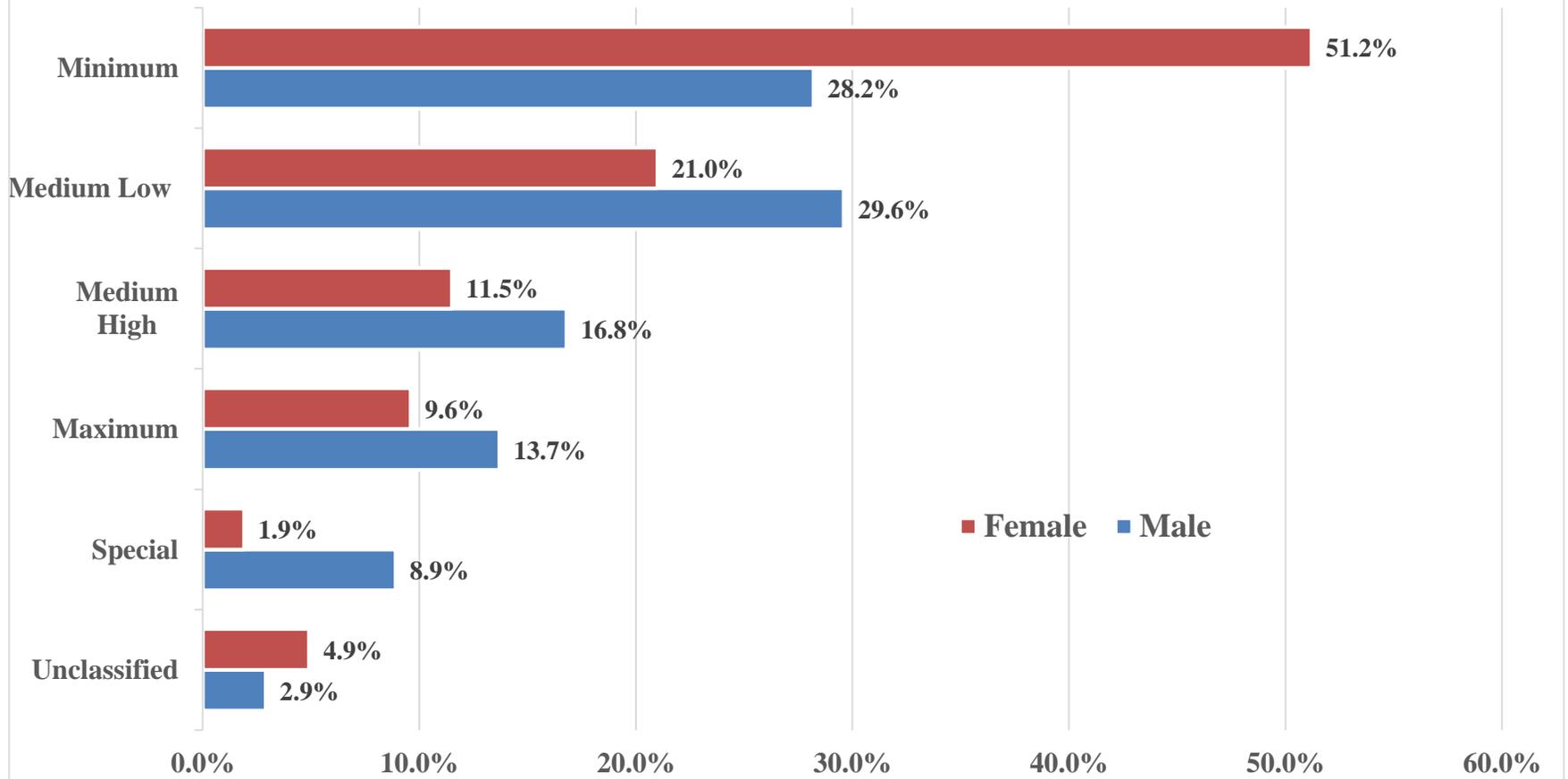

Fiscal Year 2026**
