

## 2019 JOURNAL ENTRY OF JUDGMENT (JE) EXPLAINER

This **highlighted** document is intended to explain the changes to the forms that will go into effect on July 1, 2019. These changes are due in part to the passage of new legislation which will go into effect on that date, while some changes are the result of feedback received from those who use the forms.

Please note that unless specified, the statutory (K.S.A.) references are intended to direct the user to the most current version of the statute. If a K.S.A. 2019 Supp. is referenced, this law is already in effect as of July 1, even though the statute itself has not yet been published.

### PAGE 1

- The date in the title has been changed to be used for all crimes *committed* on July 1, 2019-June 30, 2020.

### PAGE 2

- Section IV.4. – Admonition of “No probation or Postrelease allowed on or after July 1, 2011” is deleted.

### PAGE 3

- Section IV.6. – Checkbox to withhold authority of court services/community corrections to impose intermediate sanctions is deleted as 2019 SB 18 removes this provision from statute.
- Section V.2. – Departure box is enlarged to allow for more space to cite reasons for departure.

### PAGE 4

- Section VII.7. – Checkboxes two and three are updated to reflect the current subsections of the respective expungement and offender registration statutes.
- Section VII.7. – Check box to authorize ISO access to confidential PSI info is deleted as 2019 SB 18 in Section 2 codifies this duty in statute.

### PAGE 5

- Section VIII.1. - Check box and “Submitted for Electronic Signature” is added to Judge’s Signature block: The purpose of the signature block is to notify reader if the document was electronically signed through e-flex and, if so, an additional page will be present with the electronic signature.

### SEX OFFENSE SUPPLEMENT

- Section D – Title statutory citation is updated to reflect the current subsection of the definition of “sexually violent crime” statute.

## OFFENDER REGISTRATION SUPPLEMENT

- Section A. – Statutory citation for entering the age of the victim is updated to reflect the current subsection of the statute.
