# **Approval of Proposed Agenda**

Chair Fowler asked if there were objections or additions to the agenda. The agenda was approved with no modifications.

# Approval of August 24, 2023, KSSC Meeting Minutes

Chair Fowler referred to the August 24, 2023, KSSC meeting minutes. Mark Dupree moved to approve the minutes. Pat Colloton seconded the motion. The motion carried, and the minutes were approved.

### **Bias in the Criminal Justice System**

Executive Director Scott Schultz introduced the Honorable Karen Arnold-Burger, Chief Judge, Kansas Court of Appeals. Judge Arnold-Burger presented the *Race in the Criminal Justice System*. She discussed systemic racism, discrimination, or unequal treatment based on membership in a particular ethnic group arising from systems, structures, or expectations established within society or an institution. Judge Arnold-Burger also discussed sentencing reform and the benefits it could bring to the criminal justice system.

### Where Behavioral Health Meets the Criminal Justice System - Roundtable Discussion

Executive Director Scott Schultz welcomed and introduced the behavioral health roundtable participants: Dr. Megan Davidson, Behavior Health Program Manager, The Council of State Governments; Audra Goldsmith, Behavior Health Senior Policy Analyst Stepping Up, The Council of State Governments; Laura Brake, Director of Crisis Services, Behavioral Health Services Commission, Kansas Department of Aging and Disability Services; and Carolyn Coyne, Justice Involved Services Coordinator, Behavioral Health Services Commission, Kansas Department of Aging and Disability Services.

Audra Goldsmith and Megan Davidson presented the *Where Behavioral Health Meets the Criminal Justice*. Mrs. Goldsmith spoke about Stepping Up as a national initiative to reduce the number of people with mental illnesses in jail and the factors driving the crisis in the criminal justice system. Mrs. Goldsmith:

- 1. highlighted the history of the Kansas Stepping Up Technical Assistance Center,
- 2. the collaboration and partnerships across the state
- 3. upcoming projects, such as the continued operation and expansion of Stepping Up TA Center, and
- 4. the planning and implementation of a three-year project focused on launching a juvenile justice model for Stepping Up in Kansas.

### **How Much is Enough – Exploring Drug Distribution Thresholds in Kansas**

Executive Director Scott Schultz introduced Cheryl Wah, Intelligence Group Supervisor, Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA), Kansas City District Office; Timothy Hutchinson, Field Intelligence Manager, Drug Enforcement Administration (DEA), St. Louis Division; and Tony Mattivi, Director of Kansas Bureau of Investigation (KBI).

Timothy Hutchinson and Cheryl Wah presented *Drug Trafficking in the State of Kansas*. Topics discussed were an overview of the DEA St. Louis Division, including mission and priorities, drug trafficking, drug trends in Kansas, Federal Sentencing Guidelines, and ongoing DEA operations and initiatives.

Tony Mattivi, Director of the Kansas Bureau of Investigation, discussed and provided data based on KBI Forensic Science drug submissions. Director Mattivi presented information and explained the fentanyl crisis in Kansas and reported that the Joint Fentanyl Impact Team (JFIT) was created to combat fentanyl in Kansas. JFIT is a collaboration between the KBI, the Kansas Highway Patrol, and Homeland Security Investigations. JFIT aims to identify and disrupt fentanyl trafficking and distribution networks and remove the deadly drug from Kansas' streets. Director Mattivi also described the need to increase public awareness about how lethal fentanyl is and how any street drugs contain this controlled substance.

John Grube, KSSC Director of Research, presented the *Drug Weights and Severity Levels vs. Guidelines Circumvention in Kansas*. Mr. Grube discussed the drug severity level convictions for FY 2022 and the types of departures by drug severity level. Although the FY 2023 data is not fully closed, midyear data demonstrates that sentencing downward departures for drug distribution convictions are significantly high.

# **KSSC Electronic Journal Entry Demonstration**

Executive Director Scott Schultz introduced McKenna Payne, Program Manager - Custom Apps, Domo, Inc. Ms. Payne presented the *Electronic Journal Entry Demonstration*. Ms. Payne discussed the data app platform implementation. Jason Lamprecht, KSSC Senior Research Analyst, and John Grube, KSSC Director of Research, demonstrated the KSSC Electronic Journal Entry features live. KSSC is in the middle of a second pilot study group, which is currently working through practice exercises in the application to provide feedback to Domo developers.

### **2024 Legislative Proposal Discussion**

Chair Fowler and Executive Director Scott Schultz referred to the KSSC's 2024 Legislative Proposals. They provided an overview of five KSSC 2023 proposed House bills currently in two legislative committees, as shown below. Chair Fowler reviewed the KSSC Legislative Committee's recommendation to continue supporting these bills during the 2024 Legislative Session. The Commission agreed to adopt the proposal and continue supporting the legislation.
