



The Kansas Stepping Up Technical Assistance Center

The Kansas Department for Aging and Disability Services (KDADS) and The Council of State Governments (CSG) Justice Center launched the **Kansas Stepping Up Technical Assistance (TA) Center** in February 2021. The Stepping Up initiative, a national partnership between the CSG Justice Center, the National Association of Counties, and the American Psychiatric Association Foundation, aims to reduce the number of people with mental illnesses in jail. Kansas is the fifth state in the nation to launch a statewide Stepping Up initiative.

What have Kansas counties accomplished so far?

The **Kansas Stepping Up TA Center** has garnered significant interest and engagement from counties across the state. It continues to position each county in Kansas to have accurate baseline data on the number of people with mental illnesses in jails and improve their process of identifying community members who have a mental illness and are involved in the justice system. Below are some of the developments that have occurred since the TA Center launched:

- Kansas's **participation in Stepping Up** has grown from 8 to 17 counties.
- Sixteen counties have implemented a **validated mental health screening** tool at booking.
- Seven counties have completed **site visits** for customized technical assistance.
- Four counties participated in the Stepping Up **Set, Measure, Achieve Community of Practice** in 2022.
- More than 95 counties have received TA, including **peer-facilitated learning** through connections with sites across Kansas and nationally, **access to national experts**, and a central **information bank** on best practices.
- Of those 95 counties, approximately 30 have requested assistance from the TA Center in customizing county **implementation plans** to scale up or implement high-impact strategies, set targets to track progress, and achieve results.
